THIS COMPETITION WILL BE RUN UNDER 2021 BRC RULES

It is the team managers' and competitors' responsibility to ensure they and their horses are eligible for these classes and are aware of all relevant rules regarding the competition, tack and turnout etc. These rules are available online in the BRC Handbook 20210 and subsequent amendments.

Rosettes - Placings to sixth place in all classes

Class Five: 100cm

Open to All. Will be run under BS rules.

All riders should present to the Tack Check Steward a minimum of 20 minutes before their time. It is the responsibility of the rider to ensure their tack and equipment conform to the rules. Full details in current rule book.

Please remember all our helpers are volunteers here to help you enjoy your day – a smile & a thank you goes a long way

The competition will be run according to BRC rules 2021 and in addition, the latest guidance from BRC regarding Covid-19 precautions.

Restrictions on competitor numbers due to covid-19 may be necessary – more details available at a later date

Style Jumping is for both senior and junior riders. It is open to teams of four riders and to individuals. Each team consists of **two riders jumping a 75cm course and two riders jumping an 85cm course**. Individuals may choose the height at which they jump. Riders jump one round and are judged on the style of their riding. Riders must salute the judge when entering the arena, then canter a figure of eight until the signal to start is given; during this time, they will be judged for style on the flat. When jumping, the rider is judged on how they ride the whole course, particular attention being given to how they ride the turns and present the horse at a fence. The rider needs to show balanced approaches to the fences and be able to maintain a good forward canter in a rhythm. The position of the rider at take-off, in the air, on landing and in the following strides is assessed along with the correct judgement of pace. It is assumed that the rider is aware of the correct leading leg and is able to change it if needed (a flying change correctly and quietly done is acceptable as is a simple change through trot). Style Jumping will be run under the Show Jumping rules set out in section SJ1 unless superseded in this section Please refer to BRC rulebook p.65-67.

RULES

This competition will run under British Riding Club Rules. It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition – please see the current BRC Handbook and also the BRC Rule Amendments and Changes Document which can be found at the link below: http://www.bhs.org.uk/enjoy-riding/british-riding-clubs/brc-rulebook.

- No liability shall fall on the Organisers, Landowners, Judges or Officials in respect of any loss, damage or injury howsoever caused and all competitors are deemed to be liable to indemnify the said persons in respect of any such loss, damage or injury.
- The ruling of the judges are final. All complaints must be put in writing and handed to the secretary with a deposit of £10 within 15 minutes of the incident, returnable if the objection is upheld.
- ALL DOGS must be kept on leads at all times.
- Under BRC rules, any rider who has a fall from their horse anywhere on the showground CANNOT
 participate further in the competition that day. This includes falls in the warm up arena or lorry park.
 Any breach of this rule will be reported to the Official Steward. Team managers are responsible for
 making sure all riders understand and accept this rule.

Pre Entries

All entrants must pay a prelim entry of £32 per team or £10 per individual to British Riding Clubs at least 21 days before the date of the qualifier. Entry forms can be found on the BRC website for postal entries www.britishridingclubs.org.uk or online entries can be made via the prelim website https://brc.bhs.org.uk/login?referral=%2Fselect. Late prelim entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £20 per team and £10 per individual (payable to BRC HQ), if there are sufficient spaces. Late entries cannot be guaranteed therefore must not be paid for until approval from the organiser has been sought. If the date of the qualifier is cancelled for any reason, the close of prelim entry will remain. However, if the qualifier is moved more than 21 days later, entries will be re-opened but late entry fees cannot be refunded. Eligibility will be approved at the original close of prelim entry. Refunds will only be made if a vet or doctors certificate is provided.

Declarations

Emailed declarations are required and will only be accepted BEFORE 4pm on Friday 25th June 2021. Please email the declaration forms to area18.officialsteward@gmail.com

Hats

All hats must have a visible aqua BRC/BE/PC hat tag in place before they are used for warming up and competing, to show that it meets the current safety standards. There will be a trained official available on the day to do this for you if your hat does not currently have one. For up to date hat rules please see the current BRC Handbook.

Vaccinations

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Handbook. There is also a checking device on the BRC website, but if you are unsure, please call BRC on 02476 840518. PLEASE NOTE FROM 1ST OCTOBER 2020, BRC IS REVERTING TO THEIR VACCINATION POLICY OF WITHIN 6 MONTHS AND 21 DAYS OF THE COMPETITION DATE.

Vaccinations must be after 6th December 2020 for BRC class eligibility.

Microchips

From 1st OCTOBER 2020, IT IS A LEGAL REQUIREMENT TO HAVE YOUR HORSE MICROCHIPPED.

Helpers

Each Riding Club making a qualifier entry must provide helpers. The duties and times for helpers will be emailed to team managers on the same day as competition times are made available. It is the responsibility of team managers to ensure their club duties are covered. Each club needs to provide the equivalent of 2 full day helpers. Social distancing recommendations will be followed.

Substitutions

Late simple substitutions may be made at the time teams are declared. Complex substitutions must be made by **6pm Friday 21**st **June 2021**, before times are published. A complex substitution is one where teams are rearranged or horse and rider combinations are moved from one team to another. Simple substitutions are ones where a horse and/or rider replaces the withdrawn one in the same team and position. For complex substitutions email worc@hotmail.co.uk
