Show-Jumping Schedule

The Competition will be run under the BRC 2022 Handbook – it is the competitors' responsibility to ensure that they comply with the 2022 Rules as laid down in the Handbook. Show jumping will be run over 2 rounds, with a separate jump-off if required.

The running order of classes on the day may be altered, depending on entry numbers.

CLASS ONE: 70cm for Senior and Junior Teams and Individuals

CLASS TWO: 80cm for Senior and Junior Teams and Individuals

CLASS THREE: Open 80cm – Mixed Class for Senior & Junior individuals

CLASS FOUR: 90cm for Senior and Junior Teams and Individuals

CLASS FIVE: 100cm – a mixed class open to senior and junior teams and individuals; teams may be any combination of seniors and/or juniors.

CLASS SIX: 110cm - a mixed class open to senior and junior teams and individuals; teams may be any combination of seniors and/or juniors

Entry Fee: £30 per combination (plus the prelim fee which is paid directly to BRC)

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Style-Jumping Schedule

Style Jumping is for both senior and junior riders. It is open to teams of four riders & to individuals. Each team consists of two riders jumping a 75cm course and two riders jumping an 85cm course. Individuals may choose the height at which they jump. Riders jump one round and are judged on the style of their riding. Riders must salute the judge when entering the arena, then canter a figure of eight until the signal to start is given; during this time, they will be judged for style on the flat, and when jumping, will be judged on how they ride the whole course.

CLASS SEVEN: 75cm for Senior and Junior Teams & Individuals

CLASS EIGHT: 85cm for Senior and Junior Teams & Individuals

Entry Fee: £30 per combination (plus the prelim fee which is paid directly to BRC)

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Prelim entries must be received by the BRC Office & paid for by 15:00 Friday May 13th 2022; late pre-entries are subject to a surcharge

Closing date for entries: Friday 20th May

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TIMES – will be available on the CEVRC website (<http://cev-riding.org.uk>) by the evening of Friday 3rd June – any requests re timings (we will do our best, but no promises) **must** be with the Entries Secretary by 20th May.

Flu/passport checks will be done at random so please ensure that competitors have them on the day.

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HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY FOR THIS EVENT

1. The Organiser has overall responsibility for Health and Safety.
2. The event is organised in accordance with Health and Safety legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that:
 - a) everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the Health & Safety and Welfare of those attending the event.
 - b) those attending the event conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk
 - c) access to and egress from the site is safe
3. Emergencies-emergency services must have access to all parts of the event site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access. First Aid points are clearly marked.
In case of emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or dial 999 on the nearest telephone.
4. Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas/lanes and to avoid behaviour which might alarm horses.
5. Dogs **MUST** be on a lead and under close control at **ALL** times. Please clear up after your dog.
6. All competitors must ensure that they have adequate/appropriate insurance for themselves, horses, property and third party.

COVID-19 GUIDANCE

- a) Anyone displaying Covid-19 symptoms, however mild, should stay at home.
- b) Social distancing should be adhered to, especially in the secretary's tent.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Judges' decision is final
2. Legal Liability: neither the Organisers or any persons acting on their behalf accept any liability for loss, damage, accident or illness to ponies/horses, riders, spectators or any other persons or property.
3. The Committee reserves the right to alter or amend the schedule.
4. **Making a Protest:** protests or complaints may only be lodged as per the 2022 BRC Handbook.
5. Hard hats to the standard acceptable to British Riding Clubs (see their website) must be worn and correctly fastened at all times whilst mounted.
6. The competition will be run according to the Show jumping rules in the 2022 BRC Handbook.
7. Horses may compete at consecutive heights (eg. 70cm & 80cm, 80cm & 90cm etc). Horses may only compete twice in show jumping classes.

8. The Committee reserve the right to ask anybody to leave the show ground.

9. If attending the Show on your own – you MUST leave an emergency contact name and (mobile) telephone number with the Show Secretary when you arrive and pick up your number.

10. Photographs: by entering this competition you are agreeing to be photographed whilst at this event: these photographs may be used for future publicity. If you do not wish to be photographed, please tell the photographer on entering the arena, before you start your round.

11. Please do not leave horses/ponies tied to the outside of lorries/trailers unsupervised; if horses/ponies are known to get distressed when left on lorries/trailers please ensure that there is someone with them at all times. Please do not muck out onto the field, and please remove any droppings.

12. Times will be given and we ask that you do your best to adhere to them – if you think you will miss your time then please let the collecting steward know asap and they will try and fit you in before the end of the class. Please be ready at least 15 minutes before your given time - if we get ahead, we stay ahead: if we get behind, please be patient, there has probably been an incident.

DISCLAIMERS

1. Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event, BRC nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landowner or his tenant, accepts liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, cars/lorries/trailers, their contents and accessories or any other personal property whatsoever.

Entries are only accepted on this basis.
